www.syoa.co.uk info@syoa.co.uk The Yawl has been a very important part of The Salcombe Yacht club from the late 1800's. The photograph above of Kittiwake taken in 1918 shows a yawl, gunter-rigged, with a bowsprit and a sprit-rigged mizzen. The Salcombe Yawl has developed a long way since then but the spirit in the Salcombe Yawl fleet is still the same. A hand built wooden boat loved, cherished and raced.

The modern Salcombe Yawl is built for racing and based entirely on the Salcombe Estuary in South Devon, it has a history going back at least 200 years to the straight stemmed, broad transom stern yawl rigged local fishing boat. Certainly in 1806 a drawing of a scene of Easton on the Salcombe Estuary shows a small yawl rigged boat of exactly such a type. Further evidence is shown by the depiction of a very similar boat in a view of Salcombe by William Danielle dated 1823. (This is a snippet from the history of the yawl available on our web site written by Tim Street.)

The Yawls are now fast frisky racing boats with an evolving design which makes for fun controversy and challenging racing. The most recent sail number is Y189 lunched in 2011 and out of that total number there are at least two thirds still racing and some of the older boats are just as competitive today as they can be. There are two fleets the newer boats race with a 2.59 min

handicap over the older boats and in Regattas we split the fleets for convenience and safety. Salcombe Yacht Club now have Yawl Y101 which is available to members and guests for racing. So why not give it a go, contact SYC for further information. A lot of the crew and owners are ether Ex Merlin or National owners, or just people who have looked out on the estuary and said, I want to sail one of those.

The Salcombe Yawl Association was set up in 1966 to administrate the development of the class with the the full support of The RYA. The membership are a passionate feisty bunch who have looked after and developed the class since the beginning.

Salcombe is very fortunate to still have craftsman that can not only build a new Yawl but can maintain the old ones, long my that continue. Despite the best efforts of the bureaucrats to make it difficult.
